

The Golden Wattle blooms with sweetly scented, large, fluffy, bright yellow flower heads. Each flower head is a bunch of 40–80 tiny flowers.


Add a bunch of tiny yellow flowers to the four flower head stems to complete the image.

Draw the seeds inside the wattle seed pod.




