

Without researching the crest, design your own version. Compare it to the official crest. Were they similar?	Worldwide Wattle Where else does wattle grow? Is it a native or introduced species? What environments suit wattle? How is wattle viewed in other countries?
Read and Retell Find and read an Indigenous story of how opals were created. Retell the story in your own words either in writing or as an oral presentation.	Gemstone Scores How does the value of opal compare to other precious gemstones? What determines their value? How are they scored? Create a list of gemstones from most valuable to least. Make sure you include opals.	Opal Artwork Create an opal-inspired artwork by adding a single drop of clear nail polish to a bowl of water then dipping a small piece of black cardstock into the bowl.	Mining Impact Research the mining techniques used to extract opals from the ground. What is the impact on the environment? What rules are in place to protect the environment?
Biographical Narrative Find out about an Australian whose life was changed when they represented Australia in the green and gold. Write the main events of their life as a biographical story with the language features of a narrative.	Tessellation Nation Create a tessellating pattern using arrow heads – one arrow points right for the direction of the kangaroo and coloured green. The other arrow points left for the emu and is coloured gold.	Team Australia Use the green and gold colours to design the official uniform of the next Australian Olympic team. Research previous designs for inspiration. Can you include any other national symbols in your design?	Exact Colours The green and gold of Australia have specified colour codes. Over the years, some sporting teams have modified the colours to suit trends and preferences. Research the evolution of the Australian Rugby Union jersey and how a final, enduring colour was





selected.
